

WHO IS DIAMONDS?

Diamonds Ministry is a post high school women's ministry created to give women a community of girls to help grow in Christ together. At Diamonds, our mission is to first find Diamonds. When you come to Diamonds, we pray you feel loved and welcomed from the moment you step through the doors. Next, we pray for God to gradually wipe away the dirt around your heart. Then, throughout Diamonds, we pray that God can help shape you into a disciple of Christ. Lastly, once you decide to leave Diamonds, we pray that you are set in God's hands and feel equipped to make disciples of all nations!

At Diamonds, we believe everyone is created with a purpose: Made to Shine! John 1:5 is our theme verse: The Light Shines in the Darkness, and the Darkness HAS NOT overcome the Light.

We pray that throughout Diamonds, you can learn your true purpose in Christ. Like Diamonds, we are first found by God covered in dirt and shame. But, then God wipes up clean by His Spirit and we are made into a new creation. In order for a Diamond to shine, the sun needs to shine through the diamond. Just like us, we need the Son of God to shine through us to be a true reflection of Jesus.

SHRED BAG FUNDRAISER

Carmel Reformed Church is planning a new fundraiser and provide participants with a safe way to dispose of unneeded documents.

It is easy to let outdated or confidential documents pile up around the house, from old

checks to tax returns. How many times do you wind up burning those documents or simply hoarding them? Carmel is partnering with Brommer Sanitation in its shred bag program, which provides a safe means of destroying those unneeded documents.

You can purchase a \$20 bag at the church office or by contacting Elder Dan Fedders and the bag will be put in your church mailbox.

A bag is capable of holding up to 30 pounds of paper. The items in the bag must be free of most large metal clips, paper clips, or binders.

Seal the bag and either bring the bag to Brommer Sanitation or drop it off at Carmel for an upcoming shred day at the church on April 24.


The money raised will be used for a variety of building projects at Carmel.

Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- 3. Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- 5. Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!
