A helpful smile in every aisle isn't just a good slogan for a grocery store; it happens to be the unspoken motto of Carmel's door attendants and ushers, who take care to provide a warm and welcoming first impression for the many guests and visitors.

Door attendants live up to that as they courteously open doors and help people in and out of their cars or with walkers before the start of church services. That extra hand is especially appreciated by the church's senior members.

From there, ushers do their part to continue the positive experience. That certainly matches up to the experience of longtime usher John Vande Kamp, who has been guiding people to their seats for about 20 years, give or take a few. Being friendly can make a real difference on how people perceive a church.

"Especially for people new to church, it gives them a chance for someone to say hi to them. From what I understand, the most important thing when people look for a church, they like to have a friendly church. I think a lot of that has to do with how they get greeted by the doorman and the ushers and on and on. That always helps," Vande Kamp said.

For him, serving as an usher has always been an opportunity to have some friendly interaction with others and a chance to get to know people he might not otherwise get to. In the end, he feels more connected to the church having been an usher for so long.

Part of his work as an usher has been helping the new guys get comfortable in the role.

"If we have some new people coming in, I'll go talk with them and say, 'Hi, welcome aboard.' Then I just make sure if they have any questions, they know they can ask me if they need to know anything. Most of it is just a matter of putting people in the seats," Vande Kamp said. "I always try to tell them to sit people as far to the front as you can because you're going to need that room in the back at the end because no one wants to sit in the front."

It's that kind of thing that led Adam Nibbelink to describe Vande Kamp as a bit of a mentor in the role. When he started in 2011, though, it was because of his father, Terry, who was serving as an usher at that time.

"I had seen my dad usher and I watched ushers growing up. I thought maybe I'm a bit young to do that, but my dad, he said, 'They could use a little youth in the ushering program anyways,' Well, then, sure, we'll give it a try. I did and I thoroughly enjoy it," Nibbelink said.

Like Vande Kamp, it's being a part of the friendly morning interactions that has been one of the main perks of the job that he enjoys. Being inviting just helps set the tone for the rest of the service.

"The whole purpose of having ushers is to welcome people and invite them in and say everyone's welcome here—come on in and let's worship together," Nibbelink said. "I think we in Carmel do a good job of being welcoming and inviting."

He encourage young men to consider joining.

"I know when I started, the older gentlemen in the church were excited that there were young guys getting involved. I feel that way, too. I'd love to keep some younger guys wearing smiles and greeting people, too," Nibbelink said.

While it can be a challenge to keep track of family members and preferred seating arrangements in this growing congregation, some Sundays simply shuffling people around to fit everyone is enough of a challenge on its own. Holidays, profession of faiths, and baptisms are events that can draw in higher-than-normal numbers, making the job a bit tricker.

"Those are the days when every usher gets put to the test," Nibbelink said. "You find out what you're made of on those days because there's hardly any seats and you pull chairs out of the chapel or music room to give everybody a seat. I feel with Pastor Ron on his way, we're going to have those day coming up, too."

So, go ahead. When these friendly members of the church open the door for you or guide you to your favorite seat, feel free to have a quick chat, give a quick handshake and let them know the difference their positivity is making at Carmel Church. Let's remember to pray for, thank, and encourage our door attendants and ushers. If this is a ministry you would like to be a part of, you can find Hospitality Elder Leon Franken and let him know you are willing to use your gifts to build the body of Christ up.

MOTHER- AND MORE

Though I've primarily known God as Father—along with metaphors such as rock, eagle, shepherd, potter—I also learned of Scripture passages portraying God as mother. For example (all NIV):

- "For a long time I have kept silent. ... But now, like a woman in childbirth, I cry out, I gasp and pant" (Isaiah 42:14).
- "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you" (Isaiah 66:13)
- "Like a bear robbed of her cubs, I will attack them" (Hosea 13:8)
- In others, God is pictured doing traditional "women's work": making clothes (Genesis 3:21), sweeping (Isaiah 14:23), preparing and hosting a meal (Proverbs 9:1-6), baking bread (Luke 13:21),

One of my favorite images of God is tucked in Hosea. While many modern dads nurture their toddlers this way, the tender words surely call to mind a mama's care: "It was I who taught [Israel] to walk. ... To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them" (Hosea 11:3-4). Most importantly, God—however known—is loving and good.



a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase.
