HOW LONG WOULD IT TAKE?

Have you ever wondered how long it would take to read the Bible? Well, there are a lot of factors that would need to be considered to answer that question. Some of it would depend on how well you read or how fast you read. How much would you read and how often? At what point in life would you start reading the Bible? Depending on how you answer those questions, you would have a better idea about how long it would take.

Now, let's factor in the size of the Bible ... and how long it is; how many chapters there are; and how many verses are in the Bible. The Bible is arranged into two segments, what we call the Old Testament and the New Testament. Within each of those are a number of "books" that are divided into sections for easier reference. The Old Testament has 39 books, and the New Testament has 27 books. So, if you read one book a day it would take just *over* a month to read the Old Testament and just *under* a month to read the New Testament. With 66 books total, and reading one book a day, you would be able to read the Bible in 66 days.

If that seems like too much to accomplish, you could break it down into chapters. That may be a little more doable than a book a day. So, with 929 chapters in the OT and 260 chapter in the NT it would take you two and a half years to read the OT and eight and half months to year the NT. That would put you at three years and three months to read the whole Bible. The Bible now seems a bit easier to read through, but it would take longer to hear all that God has written down for our understanding.

What if?

Instead of reading a whole chapter a day, you took in the Word of God in bite size pieces? Just a verse a day. That seems much more manageable with our busy lives doesn't it? So, with a total of 31,102 verses in the Bible, how long would it take you to read the whole Bible? Let's just say you were a good reader at the age of five years old. And starting then, and reading one verse a day (similar to how we might do family devotions at meal time with a devotional book), how long do you think it would take to read the entire Bible? (Que the Jeopardy music) Would you believe that you may NEVER get through the Bible at that pace? At ONE verse per day starting at age five, it would take just over 85 YEARS to get through it all! That means you would not have read all of what God wants you to know about him and his plans for you until just before you die ... IF you make it to 90 years old.

I want to encourage us to be people of The Word. With the Bible being God's revelation of himself to the world, and also the only way for us to properly understand how we all got here, why the world is in the mess that it is, and how God plans to redeem a broken, hurting world, lost in darkness, and trapped in sin, let's commit ourselves to a habit of reading God's Word daily. Treat it like you might if it were a letter from the one you love the most in your life, reading it over and over, cherishing every thought, growing in your love for them. And isn't that who God is? The One we love the most because of what he had done for us in Jesus our Savior?





VETERANS DAY SALUTE

After fighting in World War II, Luther Bergeland wasn't done serving his country-or his God. The Minnesota farm boy, who "came back to faith" during combat, later served for decades as a military chaplain. For his actions in the field in Korea, Bergeland was awarded the Bronze Star. Then during Vietnam, he served in the Army Reserves in Colorado, tasked with informing family members about soldiers' deaths.

Despite the challenges, Bergeland embraces the special role he was able to play for four decades, sharing Jesus and his love with countless people. "That's what we did, preaching and reaching out to people," he told a reporter. "I always like the military very much because it just did a lot for me, and I hope I did a lot for it."

On Veterans Day, we salute Bergeland and all the men and women who selflessly serve.

Make decorative stones as reminders of God's many great attributes.

What you need:

- Flat, smooth stones
- Printed, decorative napkins
- Paintbrush
- Clear-drying craft glue
- Scissors
- Permanent marker

What you do:

- Unfold the napkin, carefully separating the printed side from the solid side.
- Brush a thin layer of glue atop
 a stone. Lay the napkin (printed
 side up) on the glue and press down.
 Paint more glue over the napkin.
 Let dry.
- 3. Turn the stone over and paint more glue on the back. Wrap the napkin edges around the stone, trimming as needed. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
- 4. On the stone, write an attribute of God (loving, wise, powerful, merciful, etc.).
- 5. Repeat with more stones. Use them as gifts, paperweights, table decorations, etc.
