#### ARE WE READY TO DEFEND THE FAITH?

"Beloved, although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints. For certain people have crept in unnoticed who long ago were designated for this condemnation, ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our god into sensuality and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ." (Jude 3-4, ESV)

In one of the last books of the Bible, Jude makes a plea for Christians to "contend for the faith". What he is describing in Jude 3-4 is referred to today as Apologetics. If you're anything like me, you probably thought at some point that the term apologetics had something to do with apologizing. And while they sound similar, apologetics is not apologizing for what you believe and how it may offend someone. Simply put, Christian apologetics is giving a reason or defense for the Christian faith.


Tim Barnett in an article about apologetics writes: "Apologetics is not optional. *Every* follower of Christ is instructed to be an apologist. Let me give you a few verses to back this up. Probably the most often cited passage comes from the apostle Peter. He writes, "In your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect." (1 Peter 3:15)

My hope and goal for us here at Carmel is that we not only grow in our knowledge of what we believe, but also that we can get more comfortable and confident in how to share our faith and be able to stand against those that will attack our faith. I hope to make available in the near future classes or materials that will help us in that effort.


#### NOMINATION BALLOTS








## SAVED BY GRACE
