THE FULLNESS ADVENT

In the midst of darkness, the season of Advent stands as a beacon of hope. In Isaiah 9:2, we read, 'The people walking in darkness have seen a great light.' The Light that Isaiah is referring to is the same Light that John mentions in his gospel, "In him was life, and the life was the light of men." (John 1:4) Christ came bringing hope to a weary world trapped in darkness. As we await His arrival, we are reminded that every candle lit during Advent reflects the hope that He brings, igniting anticipation in our hearts for the joy of His coming.

Advent teaches us about peace, echoing the message of the angels at Christ's birth: 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased' (Luke 2:14). As we prepare our hearts, we are invited to experience and share this divine peace amidst chaos, demonstrating how Christ's coming transforms our relationships and communities through His peace.

Joy is a defining theme of Advent, captured in Philippians 4:4, 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!' This season invites us to reflect on the joy that comes from knowing Christ is coming to restore and redeem us. With the coming of Jesus Christ, we celebrate a joy that surpasses our circumstances, anchoring our hope in the fulfillment of God's promises.

Love is at the heart of Advent, as we anticipate the coming of Christ, who is the embodiment of God's love. In John 3:16, we read, 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.' Advent encourages us to reflect on how we can extend love to others, mirroring the sacrificial love that God demonstrates in sending His Son for our salvation.

The Advent season is not just a countdown to Christmas; it is a profound preparation of our hearts to encounter the focus of all Scripture: Jesus Christ, Immanuel, God with us. In Revelation 3:20, Jesus says, 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock.' Advent invites us to open our hearts to receive hope, peace, joy, and love as we await His return. This waiting is active and transformative, preparing us to live out these gifts daily. Spend time this advent season dwelling on the hope, peace, joy, and love that Jesus brings to our lives.




CLUES ABOUT CHRISTMAS



Make this Christmas craft to display special names for Jesus.

What you need:

- Large wooden craft stick
- Small green wooden craft sticks
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Bible
- Permanent marker
- Craft glue
- Optional: star stickers or craft jewels

What you do:
