We know that God has commanded us to reach the ends of the earth with the gospel. As I've talked to missionaries in hard to reach areas across the world, I've learned that's no easy task. How Are You Making the Gospel Known?

God calls us to radical obedience, asking us to fully surrender our lives to him. If God is the all-consuming passion of your life, you will inevitably seek ways to tell others about him. Here's the thing: you don't have to be a missionary or work for a ministry to tell others about Jesus.

Do you consider the good things in your life to be gifts from God? Do you think of these gifts as things to steward for the spread of the gospel? Gifts like your freedom, your business growth, your home, your family, your education, and technology. We often take these things for granted, but they are actually amazing avenues to spread the gospel in ways the early church never could.

So, let's praise God and ask him how we can use all of the unprecedented opportunities we have today—from technology and the workplace to social influence—to let Christ's name be known to all peoples and nations. 
Deacons Corner — MARCH

Outreach Fund – The Outreach Fund is available to assist Carmel Reformed Church members participation in mission projects/trip by providing financial assistance for registration and travel expenses. This does not include normally scheduled JR/SR youth group trips. The fund will reimburse ½ of travel and registration costs up to \$500.00 per individual per calendar year. Christian Care – The Christian Care Fund is available to assist with financial needs for those who are encountering difficult circumstances and are struggling to cover their basic financial needs. Adoption Fund – For those considering an adoption please consider inquiring as to whether you will qualify for the Carmel Reformed Church Adoption Assistance Fund. Van Fundraising— We are excited to share an update on the Van Project! The final cost are in, and we are pleased to report that the total project cost came in under budget at \$117,000.00. The giving thermometer has been updated to reflect this information. Additionally, we were able to find a 2024 Ford Transit van in stock, which has already been purchased and put to good use by several church groups. We also have a 2025 model on order, which we anticipate arriving in late spring or early summer, though there is a possibility of a later delivery. 

New life defines the season of spring. Make this Easter craft that symbolizes rebirth.

What you need:

- Brown paper lunch bag
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Jellybeans

What you do:

- 1. From the bag's bottom, cut two 2-inch circles. Set aside.
- 2. From the sides, cut two 10-inch circles.
- Draw a thin spiral on each large circle and cut along the lines. Crinkle spirals gently.
- Starting at the center, wrap one spiral into a nest. Glue every few inches to hold it.
- 5. Glue one small circle to the bottom of the nest.
- 6. Repeat with the other spiral. Fill nests with jellybeans and give to a friend!
