HIGHLE HEREFORMED CHURCH "Can't Wait For Sunday" July 2025

In 1675 Samuel Rodigast, wrote a hymn to cheer his friend Gastorius, who had become seriously ill. According to some accounts, Gastorius wrote a tune for the words, expecting it to be sung at his funeral. However, Gastorius recovered, finding continued comfort in the words that his friend had written for him.

Among the many translators of this text over the centuries, Catherine Winkworth's 1863 version contains all of the power and grace that typically characterizes her work.

Rodigast's hymn quickly became popular, being employed by noted composer Johann Pachelbel in an organ piece in the early 1680s. In the following century, Johann Sebastian Bach incorporated all or part of the hymn into no fewer than six of his church cantatas, and also used the tune in several other settings as well.

Among hymns on the sovereignty of God, few can surpass the power, the beauty, and the hope of this poem written by a young man for the encouragement of a sick friend—and of many generations after him.

Whatever trial you may be going through in your life, it is my prayer that the power of this hymn, based on the timeless truths of Scripture, the enduring Word of God, will sustain you and bring you to a deeper trust in our Sovereign King.

Whate 'er my God ordains is right: His holy will abideth; *I will be still whate'er He does, and follow where He guideth. He is my God; though dark my road, He holds me that I shall not fall:* And so to Him I leave it all. *Whate'er my God ordains is right: He never will deceive me: He leads me by the proper path; I know He will not leave me.* I take, content, what He hath sent; His hand can turn my griefs away, And patiently I wait His day. Whate'er my God ordains is right: though now this cup in drinking, May bitter seem to my faint heart, I take it, all unshrinking. *Mv* God is true: each morn anew sweet comfort vet shall fill mv heart. And pain and sorrow shall depart. Whate'er my God ordains is right: here shall my stand be taken; Though sorrow, need, or death be mine, yet am I not forsaken. My Father's care is round me there; He holds me that I shall not fall: And so to Him I leave it all.

PERSPECTIVES ON PATRIOTISM



While pondering differences between patriotism and nationalism, Ryan Hamm looks to Jesus' example in Luke 19:41-44. "Jesus, it seems, loved his people, his city, his nation so much so that he cried over it," he

writes in Christianity Today. "He didn't despise his country or wish ill upon it—instead, he wanted nothing but the best for it, and it grieved him to see how his people had rejected his teachings."

This example of "patriotism perfected" can serve as guide for modern-day Christians, according to Hamm. "It's an example that's both pragmatic and romantic, shot through with justice, truth and love. It's not a nationalistic patriotism—it's a love for nation that doesn't pit it against other nations. Instead, it's a recognition of love followed by a mournful recognition of shortcomings."

Put another way, God doesn't love America more than any other nation. And he doesn't want us to worship our nation alongside him, because that is idolatry. Instead, we are to love and proclaim God above any earthly realm.





Make this candle to keep uninvited insects from your outdoor summer meals.

What you need:

- Lime
- 10-20 whole cloves
- Birthday candle
- 4 toothpicks
- Adult help

What you do:

- Have an adult slice the lime in half. Cut off the rounded end of one half so it can stand without rolling.
- 2. Insert 10 cloves into the cut sides of each half.
- 3. Stand the bottom half on a plate. Insert the candle in the center.
- 4. Insert the 4 toothpicks in the cut side of the bottom half. Then place the other half atop the toothpicks.
- 5. Before dinner, have an adult light the candle that's between the two lime halves. The flame's heat will warm the lime and create a smell that insects don't like.
- 6. Supervise the flame. Blow it out when it reaches the bottom lime.
